Glengoyne 21 – The best priced 21 year old sherry cask on the market today. Not only that, but this is an older bottling of the 21. Glengoyne is on my short list of underrated distilleries and can't possibly stay under the radar much longer. Enjoy this before the glory days are gone.



BenRiach 21 Authenticus – Think peat has to be from Islay? BS. Speyside's Benriach does peat and does it well. This 21 year rates very very well against Islays big boys.



Sullivans Cove Double Cask Small Batch – Tasmanian whisky! Sullivans Cove makes elite bottlings of whisky. They cost a lot but are great. Tasmania definitely has its own flavor.



Tamdhu 10 – Tamdhu was dead! Mothballed in 2010 I definitely shed a tear because Tamdhu 10 was one of the best deals out there at \$30. The distillery got bought last year and Tamdhu is back, but now the Tamdhu 10 is now SHERRY cask and twice the price. Is it worth it? Even I don't know... yet.



Ellenstown 12 – This stuff (likely a “secret” Ardbeg) has been around for a while, but has been discontinued. Years ago, in the infancy of LASC we had the Ellenstown 10 and loved it. We swore we’d have to have the 12 year soon. Why the hell did we take so long? Oh well, the last bottles in the world are leaving the shelves. Let’s try it for the first and last times and cherish the memories.



Tullibardine 500 – Man, this one is hot off the presses. I haven't seen it available anywhere except where I just bought it (Mission Liquor.) Tullibardine was also mothballed years ago, the reemerged 10 years later to start whisky making again. They have a brand new French owner (not Pernod) and whisky that has finally come of age. They have a brand new lineup that just came out and Tullibardine 500 is their sherry finished version.
